## CATHOLIC LIFE OF SCHOOL

The Yr11 pre-exam liturgy was a reflective and reassuring time of prayer celebrated just before the GSCE exams began. Yr11 students were reminded of their importance and beauty in the eyes of God



and how we were all created in his image and likeness. We also listened to the Gospel story '*Put out into the deep*'. This passage encouraged our students, like the disciples, to keep working even though by now they are tired and ready for a break. Finally, we listened to a reflection on the life of St. Joseph Cupertino, the patron saint of those taking exams. ## **CURRICULUM AND TEACHING UPDATES**

Curriculum: St Annes continues to deliver a robust, subject-rich curriculum, based on the National Curriculum. As we approach the last half term of this academic year, subject leaders have been reviewing and reflecting on their subject curriculums at our recent curriculum development session. Key questions included what has gone well this year and where do we need to improve our curriculum provision to ensure it is outstanding. This is the start of a bigger piece of work enhancing all aspects of the curriculum, and in particular, how the whole school curriculum knits together across each

Continued Professional Development on 'Embedding Formative Assessment' enables effective adaptations of lessons to suit student needs and ensure their academic success. We will continue to place research at the heart of what we do at St Anne's, to ensure that we are doing 'all we can do, to improve life chances'. Homework is

continuing to increase, with student participation also showing improved positive outcomes in students' examinations, and we would like to thank you for your continued support in our journey to be 'outstanding in all that we do'

# PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

After half-term we will be gearing up for a very busy summer for our students. Yr10 are preparing for their work experience in July, and we have a 'speed dating' careers event for Yr7 and Yr8 on July 1st.
