The class of 2023: GCSE results

Congratulations to the class of 2023 for their results this year. It was great to see many students on results day. Their determination and hard work paid off. From initial indications, St Anne's has secured the **best Progress 8 measure** ever. This indicator is a measurement of value added across 8 different subjects. This outcome reflects the high-quality teaching and dedication from both students and staff. However, as a proud catholic school we also believe that these results are also due to the excellent pastoral care and the growing of positive relationships between parents. It is the intention of everyone at St Annes that these results will continue to be strong. I especially would like to congratulate the following; Saoirse Murphy, Noor Nadeem, Lola Dennehy and Kian Bazrafkan who all achieved **four or more grade 9's**. This is a remarkable achievement. I must take this opportunity to also thank all the staff, including support staff, for their hard work in supporting our students.

Yr11 and meeting parents over the next few weeks

Over the next few weeks senior leaders and I will be meeting the parents of students in Yr11 who are underachieving and/or are not working hard enough in school or at home. It is crucial that students and parents understand that success, as measured by GCSE outcomes, will depend on the hard work and effort that is put in from the beginning of September. In essence, there is no substitute for hard work throughout the year. Starting off with a hard-working and positive attitude also ensures that students are less stressed as they will be more prepared for the exam season next May/June. Furthermore, if any Yr11 parent wants to meet me, please contact the school. It is better to raise issues early so that they can be addressed. Finally, Yr11 students will not be allowed to disrupt the learning of other students; this is neither acceptable or fair.

Yr10 work experience

Last year St Anne's had our inaugural Yr10 Work experience. Our aim is for this to be embedded within the curriculum and is part of the entitlement of our Yr10 students. This provides invaluable experiences of the world of work, builds confidence and raises aspirations to achieve. I received several emails from employers, and it included these comments; Students were "diligent, respectful and worked well with all our staff. They are a credit to St Anne's". Another said that they were "so impressed with our children, they used their initiative and worked independently".

I am extremely proud of the manner in which St Anne's students conducted themselves! A big thanks to Mrs Simmons who organised this week. The date for Yr10 work experience next year is week beginning 15th July. Further details will follow in due course.

Building Work

The unprecedented building work has continued throughout the summer. During the summer break new doors, windows a new heating system have all been installed. In total nearly £3Million has been invested in the building to ensure that the building is conducive to a learning environment. The work does not stop here though, as we look at improving our data network, stairwells, sports hall and repainting much of the school internal walls.

Rules

At St Anne's we have 6 [SIX] simple rules that we expect every student to follow. These rules are fair, accepted and well known. A reminder of these are below;

- Engage in active learning in all lessons
- Having the correct uniform which includes no jewellery and an appropriate hair-style
- No phones out on the school premises
- No eating or drinking on the corridors

These rules ensure that St Anne's is an efficient, calm learning environment where your child will thrive. The rules will be enforced by all staff, and I ask that parents support us in ensuring that these rules are followed. Students who repeatedly undermine these rules will put their place at St Anne's at risk.
