


- Know your RE GCSE structure: Paper 1 Catholic Christianity (1hour45mins) Paper 2 Judaism (50mins) Paper 3 Philosophy/Family (50mins) 3 separate papers and exams!
- Know your question structure:
- (a) 3 marks Write at least 3 sentences
- (b) 4 marks Make a point, explain it and link it to the question x2
- (c) 5 marks Make a point and explain it and link it to the question x2, + (Source of wisdom and authority)
- (d) 15 marks Make points for/against, then critique the points made and then conclude backing up their arguments with sources of wisdom and authority (12 marks for the answer & 3 marks SPaG)

- Intervention: only useful if you are already trying to succeed by working hard in lessons.
- Read regularly. More vocab you know the better.
- English Language: your child should be reading a novel or non-fiction text and a weekly newspaper-ideally a broadsheet.
- English Literature: Copy of texts: available electronically on our online library ACCESSIT. Some free PDFs online.
- A Christmas Carol; Romeo and Juliet; Blood Brother and the Power and Conflict poetry collection.
- Revision guides and workbooks for all these texts are available via ParentPay.



## **Expectations in Science**



GCSE: Combined Science Trilogy – AQA (Higher/Foundation)

Triple Science: GCSE Biology, GCSE Chemistry and GCSE Physics – AQA (Higher/Foundation)

- Work hard every lesson Complete all key knowledge, vocabulary, I do, we do, you do, exam question and practical work tasks with full concentration.
- Know your Science GCSE structure:

Combined Trilogy Science - 6 separate papers. Each paper 1 hour 15 minutes, 70 marks: 16.7% of GCSE.

**Separate Science (GCSE Biology, GCSE Chemistry, GCSE Physics)** - 6 separate papers. Each paper 1 hour 45 minutes , 100 marks: 50% of GCSE.

Biology Paper 1 — Cell Biology; Organisation; Infection and response; and Bioenergetics.

**Biology Paper 2**— Homeostasis and response; Inheritance, variation and evolution; and Ecology.

Chemistry Paper 1 - Atomic structure and the periodic table; Bonding, structure, and the properties of matter; Quantitative chemistry;

Chemical changes; and Energy changes.

Chemistry Paper 2 - The rate and extent of chemical change; Organic chemistry; Chemical analysis; Chemistry of the atmosphere; and Using resources.

cs Paper 1 - Energy; Electricity; Particle model of matter; and Atomic structure.

Physics Paper 2 - Forces; Waves; and Magnetism, electromagnetism and Physics only: Space Physics








### Expectations in P.E

**AQA GCSE PE** 



- Work hard every lesson in practical and theory
- Know your AQA GCSE structure: Paper 1 (Anatomy and Physiology, Movement Analysis, Physical Training)

Paper 2 (Sport Psychology, Socio-Cultural Influences, Health Fitness and Well-Being) They are worth 30% each.

Practically, you will be assessed in <u>3 sports</u> worth 10% each. Coursework is 10%.

Know your question structure and command words:

A01: define, describe, identify, outline, state

AO2: explain, suggest

AO3: analyse, discuss, evaluate, justify

75% of the exam marks are A01/2 so **KNOWLEDGE** retention is key!

AO3 makes up the remaining 25% of exam marks and will usually be in the form of an 8/9-mark question – remember **PEE** to answer these questions. 3 **p**oints fully **e**xplained with an **e**xample to gain full marks.

- **Attend** lunchtime and after-school clubs to improve your practical scores.
- Complete all H/W set on class charts These are completed in the white AQA exam booklets and will consolidate learning
  in class

- The AQA Spanish GCSE is made up of four separate exams:
- Listening
- Speaking
- Reading
- Writing
- Each exam is worth 25% of the final mark. The speaking exam is done a month before any other of the exams, and all the others are spread out across the exam period.
- Work hard each lesson: Complete all tasks to your best ability, focus and answer questions; learning a language is all about making and correcting mistakes.
- **Practice makes perfect!** Practice your vocabulary and tenses regularly. Around March time you will need to regularly practice your speaking exam prepared piece.
- Check gaps in your knowledge: Use Past Papers and the revision guides to highlight any areas you need to improve.
- Attend intervention Thursday Week B Between now and the mock in December it is an open invitation to all to build more knowledge
- Complete all H/W set on class charts These are revision and exam skills. Some online, and some book work.
- Use your knowledge organiser EVERY lesson



### **Expectations in Art**

- Ensure any work you need printed is sent on either a Word or PowerPoint document and uploaded to your folder on OneDrive.
- Be efficient, productive and work hard in <u>ALL</u> lessons.

- Devising coursework is 30% written essay and 10% practical. Make sure you put as much effort into theory as practical
- Scripted performance requires you to learn your lines and research your character before the rehearsals begin
- Complete all Homework to the highest standard and submit on time.
- Blood Brothers think about language and how actors would deliver each line based on their lives and societal context
- Billy Elliott consider how the actor is so effective portraying their character body language, facial expressions, proxemics
- Watch, watch, watch Billy Elliott and Blood Brothers as many times as possible so you know these plays inside and out

### Expectations in Music

#### **Eduqas GCSE**

- Work hard in every lesson for every component 30% performing, 30% composing, 40% appraising.
- Rehearsals and composition interventions are compulsory not attending impacts your grade and the grade of others in your ensemble.
- Exposure is key listen to baroque, classical and romantic style music as often as possible the more exposure, the more you learn
- **Keep to deadlines –** Ensure you do not fall behind.
- **Key vocab** Revise and test yourself on vocabulary each week.
- **Performance** Ensure you practice your **solo & ensemble** to performance standard. Recordings at Christmas.
- Composition-Both compositions completed by 1st December. Compulsory Interventon Week B, Music room open every night but Tuesdays.

  - Paper 2 Computational thinking, programming and algorithmic thinking 1.5hrs, worth 50%
- Ensure you have learnt the definitions for all keyword terminology this way you will be able to access the
  questions in the exam and write concise answers
- Use Craig n Dave channel on You Tube, GCSE Pod and the Revision book to revisit topics you
  found challenging create revision tools to really embed your knowledge (flash cards/mind maps)
- Complete homework activities to a high standard. They will always be linked to your exam preparation.
